With indoor presentations, performances, and vendors and an outdoor parade and chuck wagon cookoff, NCSC celebrates Western heritage and cowboy culture for those who know and love it — and introduces new audiences to the heritage and culture of the American Southwest.

On the Saturday before Thanksgiving, we doll up our courthouse square in Christmas lights, decorate the grounds with food booths, arts and crafts booths, a Santa's House attended by the jolly old elf himself, seasonal singing, wagon rides and Santa Claus officially opens the Christmas season by throwing the switch that turns on Christmas lights throughout the city! We invite you to enjoy a small-town tribute to the Christmas holidays.
Hang your hat in historic Canyon during two full days of holiday festivities, beginning with the Festival of Lights at WTAMU Friday evening at 5:30 followed by a Christmas Open House at the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum, and continuing Saturday with parade, shopping, and tree lighting surrounding Canyon's restored courthouse.
Thousands of twinkling lights decorate Fair Park, which includes seven grassy acres and Fair Park lake, the lake dam, and the wooden bridge across the lake. It's a winter wonderland complete with Santa and elves, a gingerbread house, toy soldiers, angels, trains and planes and cowboys and a Christmas sea monster rising out of the lake — all accompanied by Christmas sounds resonating from your car radio as your family rides through the park. Daily through January 1
The museum will be bustling with Christmas activity as role players in Pioneer town invite you step in and step back to Christmas in the 1890's. Santa and Mrs. Claus will be at Christmas Open House ready to take requests from children who visit them in their sleigh in the snowy woods of Hazlewood Lecture Hall. In the basement, children can make holiday crafts in the craft corner. In the Petroleum Theater, storytellers will weave Christmas stories in a cozy living room setting with a crackling fire while songs by children's choirs and entertainers fill the rest of the museum with music from the Derrick Room. The event is free of charge. Suggested admission is one can of food per person to benefit the High Plains Food Bank. PPHM's Christmas Open House began collecting donations for the food drive four years ago and is now one of the area's largest food drives.
Concerts on Thursday and Friday nights
The historic St. Mary's Catholic Church, with its POW-created murals, is open for viewing during this long-running annual festival featuring sausage, sauerkraut, bread, and trimmings. Baked goods, baby quilts, gift items, canned goods, and handmade religious items are some of the products made by members to sell on Festival day.
Activities in this collection of restored old-time buildings will include games, live entertainment, a bake sale, and a visit from Santa Claus.
Come visit with vendors and Santa Claus. Hot chili will be served as well.

The event begins at the SPC entrance with the lighting of the trees. Hot coco will be served and the SPC Symphonic Band will play Christmas music before the ceremonial "flip of the switch" by the SPC President to turn on all the campus Christmas lights! The Lighted Parade route is over a mile long and will start at SPC and travel North on College Ave, turn West onto Houston Street and end at the Square. Santa Claus will lead the parade and arrive at the gazebo to visit with all the children about their Christmas wishes and receive a goodie bag from the Marigolds of Levelland. Many other activities will take place on the Courthouse lawn while families wait to see Santa.

The Borden County Courthouse and Borden County Museum will open at 5:30 p.m. for viewing, reminiscing, fellowship, and refreshments. Santa Claus will be available to visit with the children. Join us for Christmas Music provided by local musicians, story time for children, ornament contest and door prizes, before folks gather to watch the 7 p.m. illumination of the star atop the mesa that bears the town's name.

National Bison Day is an annual commemoration of the ecological, cultural, historical and economic contribution of the American bison to the United States. It has been held each year since 2012 on the first Saturday in November.

Candlelight at the Ranch recreates a frontier holiday similar to those on the open prairie from 1780 to 1950. The event will include more than 4,000 luminaries lining the paths of the historic park as volunteer Ranch Hosts dressed in period clothing to recreate holiday scenes from another era.

With a flip of the switch, 25,000 colored lights illuminate 18 buildings around Tech's historic campus in an tradition that dates to 1959. For visitors unable to attend the opening ceremony and concert, lights can still be enjoyed nightly from dusk till midnight through January 1, 2019.

A Winter Wonderland of lighted floats travels down neon-lighted Polk Street. Center City welcomes the holidays with a lighted parade starting at 11th Ave. & Polk St. at 6 p.m. on November 30. The parade continues down to Third Avenue and over to the Amarillo Civic Center Area for the lighting of the city of Amarillo Christmas Tree, a musical program and free visits with Santa Claus & Mrs. Claus
